



**Survey Results: *What do we do with our current Northtown Library after the new one opens?***

In June we sent this survey to people on the West Ridge Community Organization mailing list. We want to thank everyone who read the survey and especially those who answered it and volunteered.

- 74 respondents completed the survey
- 20 people volunteered to pursue this and work on a WRCO committee
- WRCO will start this process in August and keep the community informed

Here are the results for the survey questions:

- The current Northtown Library building, which was built in 1962, has architectural value and is representative of the mid-twentieth century characteristics. It has good space for reusable purposes and is in reasonably good condition. Should we sell the building for private development?

Yes 19%

No 81%

- Should we re-use the building for community functions?

Yes 85%

No 15%

- Do you prefer to see this as

a multipurpose use site 85%
